Stingray Detachment Point Mugu

The MQ-25 Stingray is the world's first operational, carrier-based unmanned aircraft which provides aerial refueling and intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance (ISR) capabilities to enhance the Carrier Air Wing (CVW) and Carrier Strike Group (CSG).

VUP-19 DET Point Mugu, (FY26) the Navy's first unmanned patrol squadron will provide maintenance operations while conducting training and critical system deployment workups.

PORT HUENEME

Port Hueneme is the only deep-water port between Los Angeles and San Francisco. The port currently host a Sea Range Test Warship, formerly the USS Paul F Foster. Each year warships conduct port call operations to include testing, training, maintenance, and pre-deployment checks.

Port Hueneme is home to the Navy's Aegis Combat Systems Modernization center.

Aegis is the most deployed integrated naval combat system in the world operating on 118 warships across seven navies.

Unmanned Surface Vessel Division One

In 2021, the Navy created the first purpose-built and co-located unmanned maritime vehicle testing facilities at Port Hueneme. In 2023, the Navy established **Unmanned Undersea Vehicle Flotilla Three** to support ORCA Extra Large Unmanned Undersea (XLUUV).

Port Hueneme is home to the “GHOST FLEET” Overlord Prototypes: **USV RANGER** and **USV NOMAD**

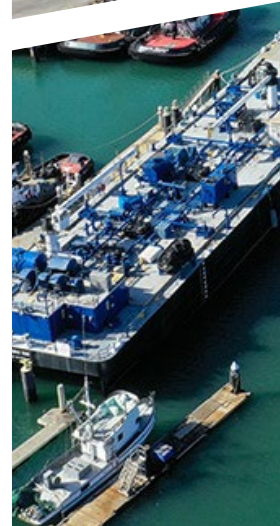

NBVC's partnership with the Oxnard Harbor District directly supports commercial shipping activities, decreasing overall port congestion in Southern Calif. And reducing national supply shortages.

- ▶ Navy relationship with the OHD established during WWII
- ▶ A MOA was established in 1992
- ▶ A JUA was first established in 1999
- ▶ In 2021, the first time a commercial dry cargo was unloaded on a Navy-owned wharf
- ▶ In 2022, the first time a FedEx vessel berthed on a Navy installation

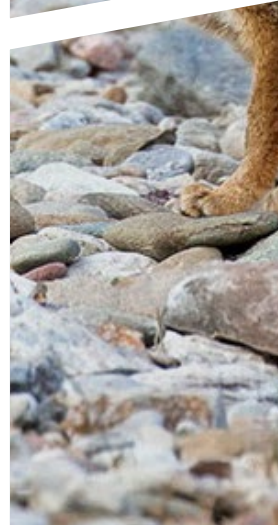

ENVIRONMENT

NBVC is firmly committed to protecting Ventura County's natural beauty. The installation has won numerous awards, including the Secretary of Defense Environmental Award in 2017, 2018, and 2019. In Nov. 2023, NBVC joined with partners to celebrate the recovery of the Island Bedstraw and Santa Cruz Island Dudleya, which was removed from the list of endangered and threatened species.
